Sessions

Animal Health and Welfare on Organic Farms

Farm animals make an important contribution to organic farming operations. This session will focus on the Codes of Practice for the care and handling of farm animals and its relevance to the organic sector.

Farm Worker /Housing Conditions & Solutions - Options for farm worker's conditions on the farm

Organic Labelling

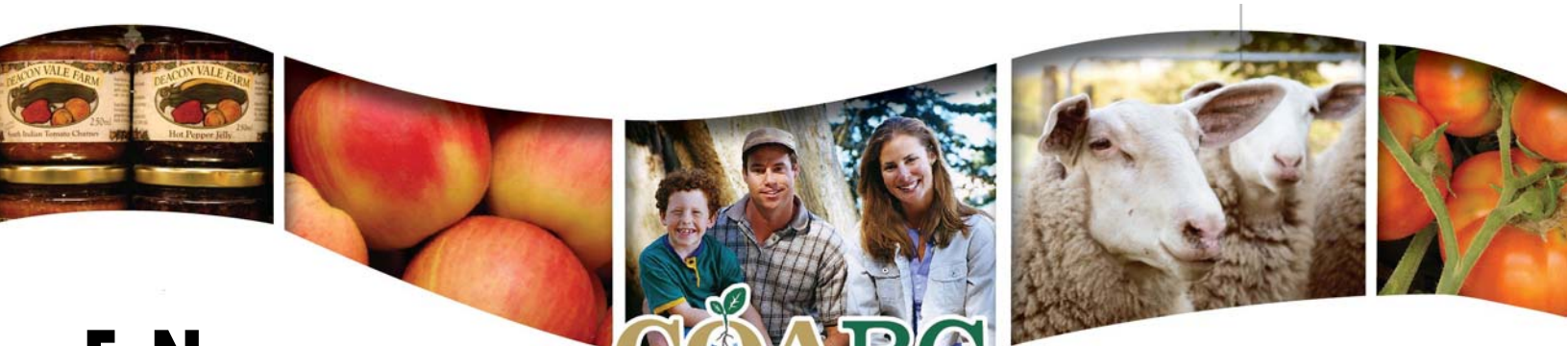
In this session Rochelle will discuss organic labeling - what is required under the Canada Organic Regime and the British Columbia Certified Organic program. She will focus particularly on good labeling practices, including use of logos and CFIA's Labelling and Advertising Requirements.

Biochar: A soil amendment for improved soil quality and carbon sequestration

Biochar is charcoal made from organic matter and is produced by pyrolysis, which is the process of heating biomass at a high temperature in the absence of oxygen. Dave McCandless built a small pyrolysis kiln to produce biochar at Fraser Common Farm Cooperative and has been experimenting with the use of biochar on the farm. Biochar has gained a lot of momentum recently and this workshop will explore the potential role of biochar in organic agriculture systems in British Columbia. The production of biochar will be discussed looking at both the possibility of on site production as well as emerging industrial scale production companies.

BC CERTIFIED ORGANIC CHECKMARK LOGO

ISO operators are fortunate to be able to use the Canada Organic label AND the BC Checkmark side by side.

The logo of the BC Certified Organic program is a key tool to identify certified organic products in BC. It is important that the symbol is used correctly; here is a quick reminder, especially for websites and the exclusion zone (white space.) The Program Symbol is enclosed by a black border. The border ensures that the appropriate white space or exclusion zone is provided around the composite mark. The Program Symbol must be enclosed by the border if the Symbol is applied against colored or complex backgrounds. However, if the background is white or off-white, it may be desirable to omit the border while ensuring the appropriate exclusion zone.

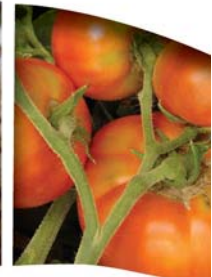
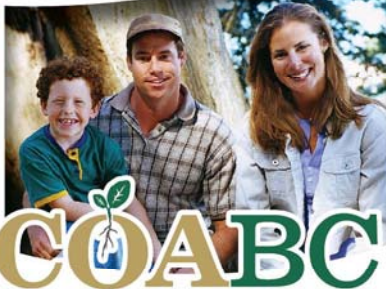

ORGANIC FARMING RESEARCH FOUNDATION SEEDS NEW ORGANIC CROP VARIETIES AND FARMING PRACTICES

Santa Cruz, CA. (January 10, 2012) Organic farmers in Oregon will be growing sweeter corn, while their counterparts in North Carolina will be testing new varieties of broccoli best suited for their farms, thanks to grants awarded by the Organic Farming Research Foundation (OFRF) Board of Directors. Additional grants will fund projects designed to help organic growers increase their yields while decreasing their expenses and impacts on surrounding waterways, and to prevent organic seed-producing crops from being contaminated by non-organic varieties. The OFRF Board approved four grants totally \$50,640 to help grow the industry's organic knowledge. Read the entire article at:
