COABC Representative: Rebecca Kneen

Rebecca Kneen has recently been elected as COABC's director for the OFC. She is the co-founder (with her partner, Brian MacIsaac) of Left Fields and Crannog Ales. Crannog Ales is Canada's first certified organic on-farm microbrewery, now in its 17th year in Sorrento BC. Left Fields is a diversified certified organic farm, growing hops, fruit and berries for the brewery as well as a small sheep flock for meat and wool, laying chickens, market garden and feeder hogs. The farm is now run by a cooperative, which is also doing value-added processing on-site.

Rebecca fell in love with farming at age three, when her family moved to a Nova Scotia farm. After university, Rebecca worked her way from farm to farm across the country, ending up in BC where she spent the next 10 years working on social justice and food access issues, including several years with FarmFolk/CityFolk. She started Canada's first organic hopyards, and has spent 14 years developing organic hops production in BC.

Rebecca served on the Board of COABC for PACS and NOOA, the Standards sub-committee of the Board, and did layout and design for the BCOG, as well as spending four years co-coordinating the annual COABC conference. She has served as the COABC's representative to the Organic Agriculture Centre of Canada's Advisory Committee. She is currently a member of NOOA's CC. She is committed to organic agriculture and to keeping it true to its radical roots and out of the hands of agri-



Standards Interpretation Committee

New public comment period – June 5 to July 5 2017

Below are questions raised by organic stakeholders, regarding the National Standards for Organic Agriculture.

- If culinary oils are harvested from an on-farm tree plantation, aka blocks of trees planted on a farm for this specific purpose, should these oils be certified under 'Crop production' (clause 5) or 'Wild crops' (clause 7.6) of the Canada Organic Standards? If the same culinary oils are harvested from private wood lots, or from Crown land timber which clause in the standards is applicable? (341)
- Can wild harvest sites be located less than one kilometre from potential sources of environmental contamination such as golf courses etc, if it is demonstrated that the wild crops are completely isolated from contact with prohibited substances by a clearly defined buffer, in accordance with section 7.6.4? (343a)
- What is the definition of “fish farm waste” used in the listing of “Fish meal, fish powder, fish waste, hydrosylate, emulsions and solubles” in Table 4.2? Does it need to be composted? (333)
- What is the status of a crop on which a pesticide was applied containing an active ingredient listed in table 4.3 of the PSL but also a formulant from List 3 of PMRA? (326a)

REMINDERS

BCCO Logo

ISO operators are fortunate to be able to use the Canada Organic label AND the BC Checkmark side by side.

The logo of the BC Certified Organic program is a key tool to identify certified organic products in BC. It is important that the symbol is used correctly; here is a quick reminder, especially for websites and the exclusion zone (white space.)



The Program Symbol is enclosed by a black border. The border ensures that the appropriate white space or exclusion zone is provided

around the composite mark. The Program Symbol must be enclosed by the border if the Symbol is applied against colored or complex backgrounds. However, if the background is white or off-white, it may be desirable to omit the border while ensuring the appropriate exclusion zone.
