Remember to bring your seeds for the seed exchange. Guidelines to participate in the Seed Exchange:

- All seeds should be open-pollinated, non-hybrid, non-patented, and GE-Free
- Bring seeds divided in smaller envelopes -- at least 20-30 seeds per package.
- Make sure to know the variety/cultivar's name and the scientific name if possible (family, genus, species)
- Share seed grower's name, location grown, population size, and isolation distance.
- When possible, share the # days to harvest, planting guidelines, original seed source, and year purchased.

Jon Alcock, from Sunshine Farm, will share his vast knowledge and experience about seed saving with us!

His belief is that growing vegetables from 'seed to seed' will help us discover the intrinsic value of the dignity of this full circle, improve biodiversity and include us in this ancient tradition. We can develop our own locally adapted varieties and those more adapted to low input organic regimes.

Join Jon Alcock for basic principles and practices of growing, selecting, harvesting, cleaning, and storing vegetable seed.



REMINDERS

ISO operators are fortunate to be able to use the Canada Organic label AND the BC Checkmark side by side.

The logo of the BC Certified Organic program is a key tool to identify certified organic products in BC. It is important that the symbol is used correctly; here is a quick reminder, especially for websites and the exclusion zone (white space.)



The Program Symbol is enclosed by a black border. The border ensures that the appropriate white space or exclusion zone is provided around the composite mark. The Program Symbol must be enclosed by the

border if the Symbol is applied against colored or complex backgrounds. However, if the background is white or off-white, it may be desirable to omit the border while ensuring the appropriate exclusion zone.
