MEETING WITH THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE

Kris Chand, COABC Vice-president and Carmen Wakeling, past COABC Vice-president met with Minster of Agriculture, Don McRae, on April 12, 2012 in Courtenay.

Among the many items discussed was the maintenance of the Canada Organic standard. Minister McRae requested more information so he could bring the issue forward with the Federal Minister of Agriculture, Gerry Ritz. Once again, the confusion caused by the use of "organic" labeling, was highlighted. COABC informed the minister that this confusion is having a negative impact on the Organic sector. Certification programs are losing members because they do not see the benefit of being certified at this time. The Minister was attentive to the issues and reiterated that the Ministry would continue to work with COABC.

NEW OSDP FUNDING RATIO

The Organic Sector Development Program is pleased to announce an improved funding ratio for applicants. The new ratio means that the applicant must provide only 30% of the total project cost, while the OSDP provides the remaining 70%.

The OSDP supports industry-led initiatives that seize opportunities, respond to new and emerging issues, and path-find, piloting solutions to new and ongoing issues in order to help the sector adapt. The organic sector is encouraged to bring innovative ideas to the OSDP. COABC is able to offer the OSDP through the generous support of the Investment Agriculture Foundation and the Government's Growing Forward Program.

BC CERTIFIED ORGANIC CHECKMARK LOGO

ISO operators are fortunate to be able to use the Canada Organic label AND the BC Checkmark side by side.

The logo of the BC Certified Organic program is a key tool to identify certified organic products in BC. It is important that the symbol is used correctly; here is a quick reminder, especially for websites and the exclusion zone (white space.) The Program Symbol is enclosed by a black border. The border ensures that the appropriate white space or exclusion zone is provided around the composite mark. The Program Symbol must be enclosed by the border if the Symbol is applied against colored or complex backgrounds. However, if the background is white or off-white, it may be desirable to omit the border while ensuring the appropriate exclusion zone.
